- Ability to deliver technical services such as preparation of Procurement Plans, Project Implementation Plans, Preparation of Procurement Documents and Evaluations etc. as required by the Project and advice the Project Director and the Director General of SACEP;

iii. the supervision of the contract, may not be awarded a contract unless the conflict stemming from this relationship has been resolved in a manner acceptable to the Bank throughout the selection process and the execution of the contract.
